
epc901 or epc611 for smartboard solutions

About the epc901

The epc901 is a high-performance CCD line sensor capable of storing a total of 4 frames in the frame store elements for ultra high-speed image acquisition. The acquisition of the image is controlled by a control signal SHUTTER. The epc901 flags when a frame is ready for read-out by asserting the DATA_RDY signal. The transmission of the frame over the video amplifier is controlled by the external control signal READ. When a read-out is initiated by a pulse on the READ signal, it is sampled by a CDS

stage. After a fixed delay the frame can be shifted out through the video amplifier by applying the appropriate amount of read clock edges.
